- Administrative/Clerical** – Volunteers provide assistance in office settings: data entry, fax/scan, filing, answer phones, receptionist, mailings, outreach, info & referrals, assist with client/patient advocacy.

- Ambassador/Usher** – Volunteers greet patients coming in through main entrance, assist with giving directions to families, patients and visitors, and/or escort and transport to their destinations.

- BOLD Buddy Program** – Volunteers visit the patients who have cancer while they are hospitalized and/or undergoing chemotherapy, and develop a mentoring relationship with the patients/clients.

- Candy Stripers** – Designed for high school students. Volunteers bring water to patients, answer call bells, assist with clerical work and organizing supplies, assist nursing staff.

- Caregiver Support Center** – Caregiver “coach” Volunteers provide emotional support and practical assistance to family caregivers while their loved one is hospitalized or in treatment.

- Child Life Program** – Volunteers supervise playroom, bedside activities, arts & crafts, reading to children and friendly visiting.

- Friendly Visiting** – Patient visits on in-patient hospital floors/rooms: talk, read, bring water, hand out magazines/books, and lift the spirits of hospital patients.

- Project Bravo** – assist with the provision of services to the AIDS affected and infected population.

- Reach Out and Read** – Read to children in pediatric waiting rooms - national medical model program.

- Research Volunteers** – Data collection, literature review, survey administration.

- Special Projects and Events** –Teddy Bear Clinic, gift-wrapping, health education and community outreach events, environmental projects.
